Accepted Waste

Household cleaners, pesticides, fertilizers, automotive fluids, cooking oil, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, small ammunition (under .50 caliber), smoke alarms, aerosol paint, hobby paint, oil-based paint, stain, pool chemicals, items containing mercury, medications

Unaccepted Waste

Commercial waste, latex paint, tires, computers, radioactive materials, dioxins, pressurized gas cylinders, explosives, water-reactive chemicals

Chemical Tips

Chemicals are a problem when you buy too much and store them.

Don't Buy Too Much

Buy only what you need. For paint, calculate the wall space and buy one gallon for every 300 square feet.

Use it all

Finished with it but still have some left in the bottle? *Use it up!* Find something else to paint or clean, or give it to friends or neighbors to use. *Don't store what you might not use.*

Read the label

Always follow the directions on the container. Products with "Danger", "Poisonous" or "Hazardous" require special handling and care.

Try alternatives

Know what you have

Prevent overbuying by taking an inventory of all your cleaners and chemicals before you go shopping. Store products in their original containers and keep labels in case of accidents.
